John 11:1-46 English Standard Version

¹Now a certain man was ill, Lazarus of Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. ² It was Mary who anointed the Lord with ointment and wiped his feet with her hair, whose brother Lazarus was ill. ³So the sisters sent to him, saying, "Lord, he whom you love is ill." .John 11:1-3

- The love Jesus has for this family is referred to repeatedly; John wants us to connect with that intimacy
- The request comes from Christ's loved ones
- The appeal is made to Christ's love
- Verse 4: This text is about the glory of Christ; we'll ask, "How?"

⁴But when Jesus heard it he said, "This illness does not lead to death. It is for the glory of God, so that the Son of God may be glorified through it." ⁵Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.
⁶So, when he heard that Lazarus was ill, he stayed two days longer in the place where he was. John 11:4-6

- How do we match up our understanding of love with this?
- Jesus is choosing to stay because He loved them!
- Insights into God's love:
- It doesn't seek to coddle us
- Teaches us that love isn't incompatible with suffering
- Its goal is to mature/complete us
- It gives us what we need most, not what we want
- When have you said, "That's not love"?

Then after this he said to the disciples, "Let us go to Judea again."⁸The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just now seeking to stone you, and are you going there again?" ⁹Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in the day? If anyone walks in the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. John 11:7-9

- How often would we rather avoid pain, and/or pursue blessing instead of intimacy?
- Where are you making decisions from speculation?

¹⁰But if anyone walks in the night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." ¹¹After saying these things, he said to them, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep, but I go to awaken him." ¹²The disciples said to him, "Lord, if he has fallen asleep, he will recover." ¹³Now Jesus had spoken of his death, but they thought that he meant taking rest in sleep. ¹⁴Then Jesus told them plainly, "Lazarus has died,

¹⁵and for your sake I am glad that I was not there, so that you may believe. But let us go to him." ¹⁶ So Thomas, called the Twin, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go, that we may die with him." ¹⁷Now when Jesus came, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb four days. John 11:11-17

- Jesus lets Lazarus die (and all that implies) for Christ's glory
- On Christ's timetable
- With goals oriented to a different place

²⁰ So when Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met him, but Mary remained seated in the house. ²¹Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. ²²But even now I know that whatever you ask from God, God will give you." ²³Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." ²⁴ Martha said to him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day."

²⁵Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, ²⁶and everyone who lives and believes in me⁾ shall never die. Do you believe this?" ²⁷She said to him, "Yes, Lord; I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who is coming into the world."

John 11:20-27

- Faith and doubt both in verse 21
- There's a hint of suspicion of Christ's love
- Doubt & faith
- "I am the resurrection"
- I am exactly what Lazarus needs and what you need
- We seek plans and answers; God gives us the person of Jesus
- Verses 6, 17, 24 God often waits, doesn't He?

¹⁸Therefore the LORD waits to be gracious to you, and therefore he exalts himself to show mercy to you. For the LORD is a God of justice; blessed are all those who wait for him. Isaiah 30:18 ¹⁴ Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD! Psalm 27:14

- Where are you doubting, not even considering that God could do something?
- Don't judge before the resurrection

³²Now when Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet, saying to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." ³³When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in his spirit and greatly troubled. ³⁴And he said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord, come and see." ³⁵ Jesus wept. ³⁶So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" ³⁷But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man also have kept this man from dving?" John 11:32-36

- Therefore ~ Because of their tears and her question, He is troubled; why?
- Troubled = Angry/disturbed
- He's greatly disturbed at their lack of faith/disbelief
- That His love is questioned
- How does God respond when we doubt and question Him?
- God cried

³⁸Then Jesus, deeply moved again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay against it. ³⁹Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, by this time there will be an odor, for he has been dead four days." ⁴⁰Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed you would see the glory of God?" ⁴¹So they took away the stone. And Jesus lifted up his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me.

⁴² I knew that you always hear me, but I said this on account of the people standing around, that they may believe that you sent me." ⁴³When he had said these things, he cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out." ⁴⁴ The man who had died came out, his hands and feet bound with linen strips, and his face wrapped with a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."

John 11:38-44

 ⁴⁵ Many of the Jews therefore, who had come with Mary and had seen what he did, believed in him,
 ⁴⁶but some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done.

John 11:45-46

- Belief 6 times
- Suffering often produces stronger disciples
- We would naturally choose healing over intimacy, blessings over loving God more fully
- Belief is not about knowledge; its about a willingness to believe

- God's love is real and deeper than you can imagine
- God's delay doesn't mean He doesn't love you

LAZARUS

- Hears his Shepherd's voice from beyond the grave
- His only hope; no one else came who could help; Lazarus couldn't get out if he wanted to; he was *REALLY* dead
- Couldn't heal himself couldn't respond until he was called

- Will you see Christ?
- Weeping
- Will you hear His voice?
- I am the resurrection and the life seek Me!
- Will you hear His voice?
- Come forth!
